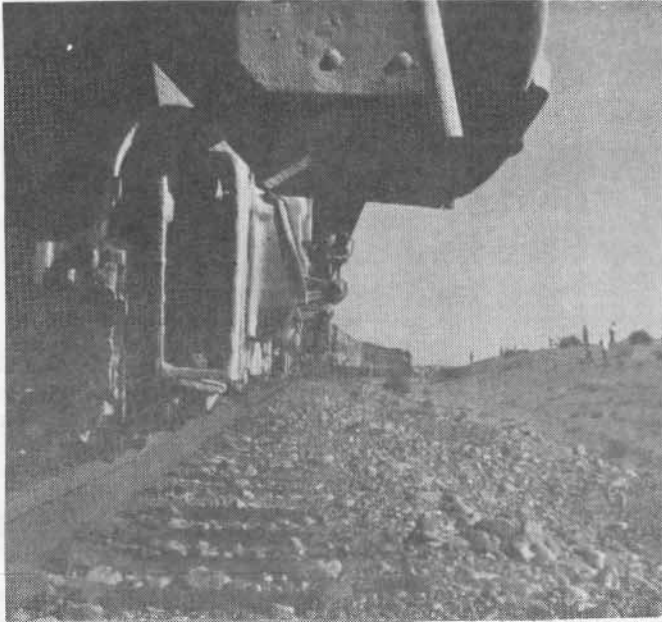


PUERTO PEÑASCO EXCURSION



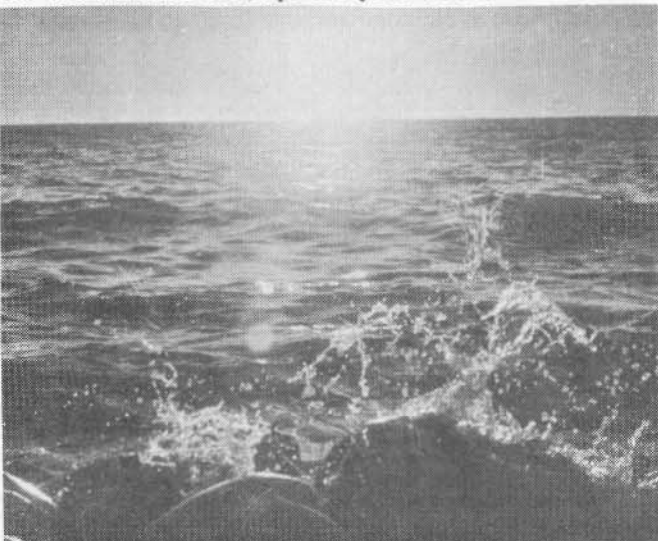
After more than seven month's delay, PSRMA will again sponsor its popular one-day excursion to Puerto Peñasco on May 16th. The special train will leave Mexicali and head across the Sonora Desert on the rails of the Sonora-Baja California Railroad.

Union-Tribune staff photographer Thane McIntosh pictures here for REPORT a brief preview of what one can expect to find in the sleepy Mexican town of Puerto Peñasco which is the destination of the trip.

For the first time, passengers will be able to board the special train right at the border, eliminating the need to drive across the border to the depot. The train will stop at the depot before leaving Mexicali to pick up any passengers waiting there. Arrival in Puerto Peñasco is scheduled for 12:45 pm with the return train departing at 4pm. Return to Mexicali is scheduled for 7:30 pm with the train stopping at both the depot and the border to unload passengers.

Once again PSRMA will be operating busses from San Diego for those who prefer not to drive. Fares for the train trip are \$12 for adults, \$9 for children and \$10.50 for PSRMA members. Bus fares are \$7.50 for adults and \$6.50 for children.

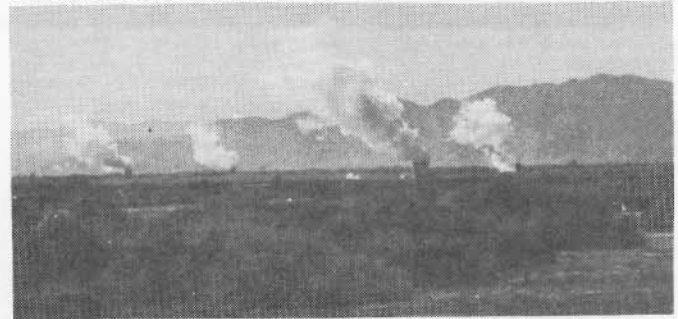

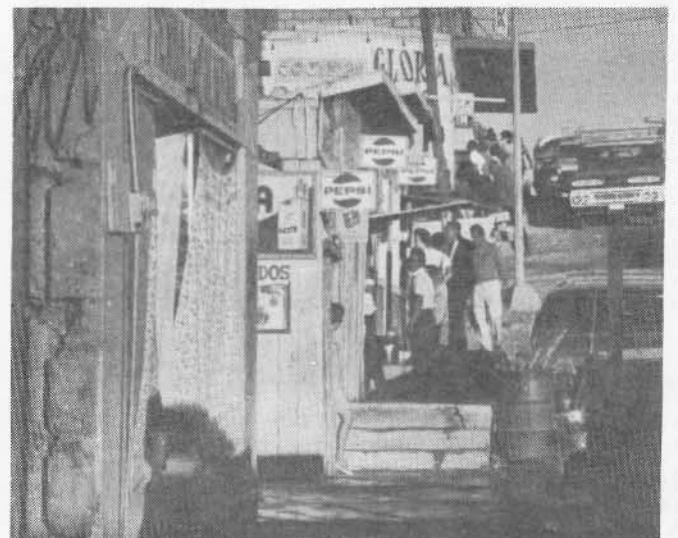
SEA OF CORTEZ...Wave breaks on the rocky shore at the edge of Puerto Peñasco. The village lies on the coast.
